Theme 2022-‘Gender equality today for a sustainable tomorrow’

According to UN Women, the theme for International Women's Day, 2022 (IWD 2022) is ‘Gender equality today for a sustainable tomorrow’. It attempts to recognise the “contribution of women and girls around the world, who are leading the charge on climate change adaptation, mitigation, and response, to build a more sustainable future for all”. ‘#Break The Bias’. The success of the programme lies in the method of training, which goes beyond classroom teaching by including application based games- students are made to play games or are asked vital questions like which are the spaces that make you feel uncomfortable, this brings out their personal thoughts and opinions proving that girls and boys are equal. You could be a part of this change as well, having a dialogue with people who are a part of the education system can go a long way also. An interesting quote by Sonia Sotomayor, the third woman to serve in the High Court of the United States: **"Until we get equality in education, we won't have an equal society."**

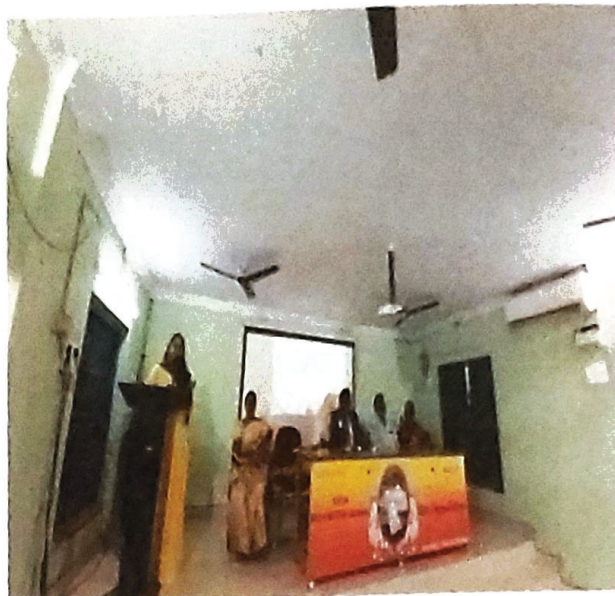

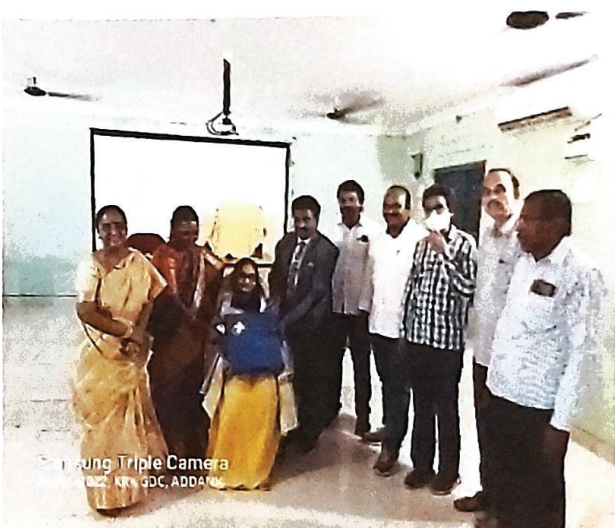
